


MONUMENT SIGN DESIGN for business

For the new Tumwater Vineyard & Barrel House a proper monument was required. I designed a 'modern rustic' stone veneer-faced column with a steel through-pin and cantilevered steel box beam sign. The through-pin was to replicate a rough hewn wood log with 'wood' steel spike set screws. The main sign was themed for a rusted patina, with laser-cut lettering and an LED backlight module. For presentation I then crafted a paper model to allow everyone a strong visual that would keep the project on course through time and many hands. The finished sign was done to specification and it looks great. Kudos to Levi Levasa, Spencer Vetter and Ron Estey for overcoming logistic hurdles. In all — it was the determination of Gordon Root and Rick Waible that finally made it reality. A hearty thanks to Wright Masonry and Refined Metalworks for bringing it to life.

Design notes: When designing the sign I wanted to ensure that if it were impacted by a vehicle, repair was do-able. Consideration was made for lighting panel maintenance and to make the sign vandal resistant.
